Progress in Paediatric Parasitology

Throughout the world the burden of parasitic and infectious diseases in children is varied, often substantial and perhaps even growing. Even in Europe, our battle with parasites is far from over especially international travel and with HIV-mediated illnesses both here and abroad.

The symposium will bring together a panel of invited speakers exploring the interface between medical parasitology and paediatrics. The meeting will take a disease-specific theme throughout and focus upon progress in clinical management, disease epidemiology and implementation of large-scale control programmes in the developing world.

Running over two days, the symposium will feature sessions on protozoan and helminth infections as well as an open poster session for attendees. Poster prizes will also be awarded.
